 PRESERVED in Jesus Christ (Jude 1).

II. You are saved from the penalty of sin but not the presence of sin.

- A. Now you have two natures, "Christ's **<u>DIVINE</u>** nature (II Peter 1:4), and an old nature.
- B. You are to **SHOW FORTH** the **PRAISES** of Him who hath called you out of **DARKNESS** ... (I Peter 2:9).
- C. You will have to fight the desires of the flesh. God warns "...abstain from **FLESHLY**

<u>LUSTS</u>, which war against the soul. (I Peter 2:11)

D. God will help you if you let Him. "The Lord knoweth how to **DELIVER** the **GODLY** out of **TEMPTATIONS** (II Peter 2:9). See also I Corinthians 10:13.

III. If you sin you do not loose your salvation but you do lose the joy of your salvation. That joy can be restored.

- A. King David, after committing adultery and causing a man to die was faced by God with his sin. David was suffering because of his sin. He cried out "Restore unto me the **JOY** of Thy salvation;" (Psalms 51:12)
- B. In the first three verses of Psalms 51 David cried out "Have mercy upon me, O God, according to thy LOVING KINDNESS..." (v1). "WASH me throughly... and CLEANSE me from MY SIN." (v2) "For I ACKNOWLEDGE my transgression...(v3)
- C. In a portion of Scripture written to the saved God says that if we confess our sins He is faithful and just to **FORGIVE** us our sins and to **CLEANSE** us from **ALL** unrighteousness. (I John 1:9)

Remember, You cannot lose your salvation!

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BAPTISM

*Lesson Three

I. Why should I be baptized?

- A. Go therefore and teach all nations,

 <u>BAPTIZING</u> <u>THEM</u> in the name of the
 Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy
 Ghost: (Matthew 28:19)
- B. If ye love me, <u>KEEP MY</u>
 <u>COMMANDMENTS</u> (John 14:15). *God commanded it!*

II. When should I be baptized?

- A. Here is water; what doth hinder me to be baptized? if thou <u>BELIEVEST</u>

 <u>WITH ALL THINE</u>

 <u>HEART</u>, thou mayest. And He answered and said, I <u>BELIEVE</u> that <u>JESUS CHRIST</u> is the <u>SON</u> of <u>GOD</u>. (Acts 8:36b, 37).
- B. Read Acts 16: 25-33. The jailer asked "What must I do to be saved?" And he was told to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ (believe that Jesus is the Savior that He shed His blood for our sins and died, but rose again). The jailer and all his household obviously accepted Jesus as their Savior that night. The second half of Acts 16:33 states ... And was baptized, HE AND ALL HIS, STRAIGHTWAY.
- C. . . . And many of the Corinthians

 HEARING, BELIEVED and were baptized. (Acts 18:8b).

In each example, the people first made a decision to accept Jesus as the Christ, and as their personal Savior. Immediately

following their salvation they were baptized.

III. How should I be baptized?

- A. And Jesus, when He was baptized, went <u>UP</u>

 <u>STRAIGHTWAY</u> <u>OUT</u> <u>OF</u> <u>THE</u>

 <u>WATER</u>: (Matthew 3:16a)
- B. And John also was baptizing in Aenon near to Salim, because THERE WAS MUCH WATER THERE: and they came, and were baptized (John 3:23). .Sprinkling would not require much water.
- C. And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both INTO THE WATER, both Philip and the Eunuch; and he baptized him. And when they WERE COME UP OUT OF THE WATER.... (Acts 8:38 & 39).

The word "baptize" means "to dip, plunge, submerge, or immerse." It is a picture of Christ's death, burial and resurrection. We go down, as in dying; under the water, as into the grave; we come up out of the water to show the resurrection to new life.

When we are baptized in this manner, we are showing to the world that we are now one with Christ Jesus.

II. Why should I read, study and know my Bible?

- A. Thy word is a <u>LAMP</u> <u>UNTO</u>

 <u>LIGHT</u> <u>UNTO</u> <u>MY</u>

 <u>PATH</u>. (Psalm 119:105)
- B. Thy word have I hid in mine heart, <u>THAT</u>
 <u>I MIGHT NOT SIN</u>
 <u>AGAINST THEE</u>. (Psalm 119:11)
- C. Study to show THYSELF
 APPROVED UNTO GOD,
 a WORKMAN THAT
 NEEDETH NOT TO BE
 ASHAMED rightly dividing the
 Word of truth. (II Timothy 2:15)

The Word of God is indeed our guide as well as our guard.

III. How much and how often do we need God's Word?

- A. And it (the Word of God) shall be with him, and he SHALL READ

 THEREIN all the DAYS of HIS LIFE: that he may

 LEARN to FEAR the LORD his GOD, to keep ALL the WORDS of THIS LAW and these

 STATUTES, to do them:
 (Deuteronomy 17:19)
- B. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart:

 And thou shalt teach them diligently unto they children, and shalt <u>TALK OF THEM</u> when <u>THOU SITTEST</u> in thine house, and when thou <u>WALKEST</u> by the <u>WAY</u>, and when thou <u>LIEST DOWN</u>, and when thou <u>RISEST</u> up. (Deuteronomy 6:6&7)

In John 15:3&4, Jesus states, Now ye are clean through the Word which I have spoken unto you. Abide in me, and I in you. To abide is to stay with. Jesus makes it clear that we need His Word DAILY!

I. Who makes up the Church?

A. And the Lord <u>ADDED</u> to the <u>CHURCH</u> <u>DAILY</u> such as should be **SAVED** .Acts 2:47

B. Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, to them that are sanctified in <u>CHRIST</u>

JESUS, called to be <u>SAINTS</u>, with all that in every place <u>CALL</u>

<u>UPON</u> the <u>NAME</u> of <u>JESUS CHRIST OUR</u>

<u>LORD</u>, both theirs and ours.

I Corinthians 1:2.

The Church is made up of believers; the Church belongs to God.

II. Are local churches found in the Bible?

- A. I commend unto you Phebe our sister, which is a servant of the **CHURCH** which is at **CENCHREA**... Romans 16:1.
- B. Unto the church of God <u>WHICH</u> is at <u>CORINTH</u> ... I Corinthians 1:2.
- C. ...Unto the <u>CHURCH</u> of <u>GALATIA</u> ... Galatians 1:2.
- D. Not forsaking the **ASSEMBLING** of **OURSELVES TOGETHER**, as the manner of some is: Hebrews 10:25.

As you can see, the Bible clearly teaches that Christians gather in local churches.

III. Why must I go to Church?

A. For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do **SHOW** the **LORD'S DEATH** till He come.

I Corinthians 11:26

This speaks of taking communion and is to be done until Jesus comes again.

B. Then they that GLADLY RECEIVED
HIS WORD were BAPTIZED: and
the same day there were ADDED
UNTO THEM about three
thousand souls. Acts 2:41

C. And he (God) gave some apostles; and some, prophets; and some evangelists and some pastors and teachers; for the <u>PERFECTING</u> of the <u>SAINTS</u>, (saved ones), for the <u>WORK</u> of the <u>MINISTRY</u>, for the <u>EDIFYING</u> of the <u>BODY</u> of <u>CHRIST</u>: Ephesians 4:11&12.

King David said, "I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the House of the Lord." (Psalms 122:1)

God has established the Church, and we must not forsake it.

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COMMUNION - THE LORD'S SUPPER

*Lesson Six

I. What is the Lord's Supper?

- A. There are three Bible Terms for "The Lord's Supper".
 - 1. C **OMMUNION** (I Corinthians 10:16)
 - 2. The L <u>ORD'S</u> T<u>ABLE</u>. (I Corinthians 10:21)
 - 3. The L <u>ORD'S</u> S <u>UPPER</u>. (I Corinthians 11:20)

The Bible does not mention such manmade ecclesiastical terms as "the Mass", "Holy Communion", and "Eucharist".

- B. It is an O **RDINANCE** of the church (I Corinthians 11:2).
- C. When we partake of the Lord's Supper, we:
 - 1. Do it in R **EMEMBRANCE** of Christ (I Corinthians 11:24-25).
 - 2. To S <u>**HEW**</u> the Lord's death till He come (I Corinthians 11:26).

The Lord's Supper (Communion) is a symbol and a memorial.

II. Symbolism of the Lord's Supper.

- A. What are the symbols of the Lord's Supper, and what do they represent?
 - 1. Unleavened **BREAD**. (Matthew 26:17)
 - 2. The F **RUIT** of the V **INE**. (Matthew 26:29)

Nowhere does the Bible refer to "wine" as part of the Lord's Supper. Alcoholic (fermented) wine is a result of the action of yeast (leaven). Leaven is a symbol of sin (I Corinthians 5: 6-7). Thus, alcoholic wine and leavened bread would be invalid symbols of the spotless Son of God.

- B. What does the bread symbolize?
 The bread pictures the broken **BODY**of the Lord Jesus Christ.
 (I Corinthians 11:24)
- C. What does the cup symbolize?
 The cup (grape juice) pictures the shed **BLOOD** of the Lord Jesus Christ.
 (I Corinthians 11:25)

When we observe the Lord's Supper, we show the Lord's death until He comes again. (I Corinthians 11:26)

III. Who should observe the Lord's Supper?

- A. Who was Paul addressing in I Corinthians 11:2? "Unto the **CHURCH** of God ..."
- B. Who was Paul addressing in I Corinthians 11:33? "Wherefore my **BRETHERN** when ye come together to eat, tarry one for another."

The church is made up of the Saved. This ordinance is not for the Unsaved. It has no cleansing or saving power.

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PRAYER

*Lesson Seven

I. What is prayer?

- A. "<u>ASK</u>, and it shall be given you: <u>SEEK</u>, and ye shall find <u>KNOCK</u>, and it shall be opened unto you." (Matthew 7:7)
- B. "... that whatsoever ye shall <u>ASK</u> of the <u>FATHER</u> in my name..." (in Jesus' name). (John 15:16)
- C. "It is a good thing to GIVE THANKS unto the LORD..."
 (Psalms 92:1)
- D. "I will **PRAISE** Thee, O **LORD** my **GOD**..." (Psalms 86:12)

Prayer is asking from God our need; it is seeking His will and His direction, as well as praising Him.

II. When should I pray?

- A. "My voice shalt thou hear in the **MORNING**, O Lord;" (Psalms 5:3)
- B. "EVENING, and MORNING, and at NOON, will I pray, and cry aloud: and He shall hear my voice." (Psalms 55:17)
- C. "And He spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought <u>ALWAYS</u> to <u>PRAY</u>, and not to faint." (Luke 18:1)
- D. "Pray <u>WITHOUT</u> <u>CEASING</u>." (I Thessalonians 5:17)

III. How should I pray?

A. "After this manner therefore pray ye: <u>OUR</u>
<u>FATHER</u> . . ." (To the Father).
(Matthew 6:9)

- B. "If ye will ask anything in <u>MY</u> <u>NAME</u>, I will do it" (in Jesus' name). (John 14:14)
- C. "Likewise the **SPIRIT** also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the **SPIRIT ITSELF** maketh intercession for us . . ."
 (with the Holy Spirit's help). (Romans 8:26)
- D. "And this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything **ACCORDING** to **HIS WILL** He heareth us:"

 (I John 5:14). **You must ask in His will.**
- E. "Let us therefore come **BOLDLY** unto the throne of grace . . ."

 Come boldly, you need not fear your heavenly Father (Hebrews 4:16).

Sin will hinder your prayers. Be sure to keep your heart and mind right before God. If you have failed God in any way, confess it to God and ask His forgiveness so that your prayers may be heard by God once more. Read Psalms 66:18 and I John 1:9.

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CARING & SHARING - WITNESSING

*Lesson Eight

I. Why must we share Christ and His salvation with others?

A. How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in <u>HIM</u> of whom <u>THEY</u> <u>HAVE</u> not <u>HEARD</u>?...
(Romans 10:14).

Unless we tell them they cannot know.

B. ... no man <u>CARED</u> for <u>MY</u> <u>SOUL</u> (Psalm 142:4 last line).

They need us to care for their souls.

C. ... JOY shall be in <u>HEAVEN</u> over one sinner that repenteth. . . (Luke 15:7b). Likewise, I say unto you, there is <u>JOY</u> in the presence of the <u>ANGELS</u> of <u>GOD</u> over <u>ONE SINNER</u> that repenteth (Luke 15:10).

It brings joy to God, even to His angels!

D. Let the redeemed of the Lord **SAY SO**. . . (Psalm 107:2). *It is expected of us.*

<u>II. When, where and how am I to share the</u> gospel with others?

A Therefore they that were scattered abroad went every where **PREACHING** the **WORD** (Acts 8:4).

The word preaching here means to announce the good news of the gospel.

B. He that <u>GOETH</u> forth and <u>WEEPETH</u>, bearing <u>PRECIOUS</u> <u>SEED</u> (the Word of God). . . (Psalm 126:6a).

C. GO YE therefore, and teach ALL NATIONS... (Matthew 28:19)

The last words of Jesus to the eleven disciples.

Tell others wherever you are; endeavor to reach out. Note the words go, goeth, and went in the previous verses. Use precious seed, the Word of God.

D. For I AM NOT ASHAMED of the GOSPEL of Christ . . . (Romans1:16a)

Paul was not ashamed of the gospel. Do not be ashamed, it is able to bring people to salvation.

E. For consider Him(Jesus) that **ENDURED** such contradiction of sinners against **HIMSELF**, lest ye be wearied and **FAINT** in your minds (Hebrews 12:3).

When others argue or reject, remember, Jesus was often falsely accused and his words were rejected, but He prayed and went on.

F. Follow <u>PEACE</u> with <u>ALL</u> men, and <u>HOLINESS</u>...(Hebrews 12:14)

Be a fit vessel for carrying the gospel.

TITHING AND OFFERING

Lesson Nine*

I. Before the law holy men gave tithes and offerings to God.

- A. And he(Abraham) gave him **TITHE** (a tenth) of all (Genesis 14:20, last sentence).
- B. ... and of all that thou shalt give me (Jacob) I will surely give the <u>TENTH</u> unto thee (Genesis 28:22b).
- C. And the Lord had respect unto Abel (Adam and Eve's son) and to his **OFFERING**. (Genesis 4:4 ,last line).

II. The law required a tithe to be given. Neglecting to do so brought God's great displeasure.

- A. And verily they that are of the sons of Levi, who receive the office of the priesthood (Jewish), have a commandment to take **TITHES** of the people according to the law,.... (Hebrews 7:5).
- B. Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say wherein have we robbed Thee? In <u>TITHES</u> and <u>OFFERINGS</u> (Malachi 3:8)

III. The Bible shows us that the tithes and offerings are to be brought into the church.

A. Bring ye all the tithes **INTO** the **STOREHOUSE**... (Malachi 3:10).

B. Upon the first day of the week (Sunday) let **EVERYONE** of **YOU** lay by him in store as God hath prospered him (I Corinthians 16:2).

IV. Give tithes and offerings with a right heart and God will bless you.

- A. Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not **OPEN** you the **WINDOWS** of **HEAVEN**, and pour you out a **BLESSING**...(Malachi 3:10)
- B. ... And he which SOWETH
 BOUNTIFULLY shall REAP
 also BOUNTIFULLY (II Corinthians 9:6 last line)
- C. For God loveth a <u>CHEERFUL</u> <u>GIVER</u>. II Corinthians 9:7 (last line)

Our tithes and offerings are used for the sake of the gospel in things such as support of the pastor (I Corinthians 9:13 & 14), support of missionaries, as in Paul's life (Philippians 4:10), and provisions for a meeting place and teaching materials.

SEPARATED, SET APART

Lesson Ten*

I. As a Christian, you are set apart from the World and unto God.

A. But as He which hath called you is Holy, so **BE YE HOLY**...(1 Peter 1:15a).

B. Love not the <u>WORLD</u> neither the things that <u>ARE IN THE</u> <u>WORLD</u>... (1John 2:15a). See also James 4:4.

C. For all that is in the world, the <u>LUST</u> of the <u>FLESH</u>, and the <u>LUST</u> of the <u>EYES</u>, and the <u>PRIDE</u> of <u>LIFE</u>, is not of the <u>FATHER</u>... (I John 2:16).

II. The Bible teaches us to behave differently form the World.

A. And be not **CONFORMED** to this **WORLD**: but be ye **TRANSFORMED** by the **RENEWING** of your **MIND**... (Romans 12:2 a).

B. Let no <u>CORRUPT</u> communication (bad talk) proceed out of your <u>MOUTH</u>, . . . (Ephesians 4:29a). See also James 4:6-10.

C. I will set no **WICKED** thing **BEFORE** mine **EYES**: (Psalm 101:3a).

D. . . . remove thy <u>FOOT</u> from <u>EVIL</u> (Proverbs 4:27b). See also 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 & 2 Corinthians 7:1 *Initial that you have read these.*

III. The Bible teaches that there is to be a definite separation between true Christians and non-Christians. It also shows us that we cannot have agreement with other religions.

A. Be ye not **UNEQUALLY YOKED**

<u>TOGETHER</u> with <u>UNBELIEVERS</u>: (2 Corinthians 6:14a). See also verse 17.

B. And what agreement hath the temple of God with **IDOLS** (2 Corinthians 6:16a)?

As a true born again believer God lives in you.

C. But though we or an <u>ANGEL</u> from <u>HEAVEN</u> preach any <u>OTHER</u> <u>GOSPEL</u> unto you than that which we have preached unto you let him be <u>ACCURSED</u> (Galatians 1:8).

D. If there come any unto you, and bring not this **DOCTRINE** (salvation through Christ alone) receive him **NOT** into your **HOUSE**, neither bid him God speed (2 John 9 &10).

While the world is trying to get everybody together, God teaches a definite separation. Those who believe in getting to Heaven by keeping church ordinances, just being morally good, trusting in baptism for salvation, etc. are not to be joined together with by true Christians. Some religions have idols as part of their church and home life. Still others follow new revelations or new prophets, (those who came on the scene since Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection). All of these are spiritual counterfeits. God's desire is that the individuals be shown the error of their way, but He does not sanction joining with them in private church or public groups.
