Sheep must have a shepherd to guide them and keep them safe. They would soon die or be killed without a shepherd. The Bible calls Jesus "The Good Shepherd". The good shepherd gives his own life for the sheep.

The sixth word in Romans 5: 10 shows us that without Jesus we are God's en _ m _ es.

The Bible tells me and you in Ephesians 2:1 that without Jesus we are d __ ad in trespasses and sin.

When sin came into the world we died spiritually. God separated Himself from us because he cannot live with sin.

Romans 3:23 says "For all have sinned, and come s __ _ r __ of the __ I __r __ of G __ d;"

Sin is when we lie, cheat, steal, hurt others in anger, disobey and many other things. You cannot go into heaven the way you are. You are a sinner.

That all sounds very bad but God loved you so much that he made a way to heaven through his own son, Jesus. Jesus is his gift to you.

The word commendeth means that God showed us his love

by doing this for us. He sent his Son, Jesus, to die on the cross. Jesus is called "The Lamb of God". Jesus shed his own blood to wash away your sins.



Jesus did not stay in the grave after he died. Because Jesus is God, he rose again and went back to His Father in Heaven.

With His blood He can wash away your sins so you can go to

Heaven when you die.

The Bible tells you how to get the gift for yourself.

Romans 10:9 and 10 tells you to confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus, and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead. God will save you from sin. Believe in Jesus with all your heart and tell God with your own mouth that you want him to forgive your sins. Tell Him you want Jesus to be your Saviour.

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You may bow your head and pray right now. Say something like this. "Lord Jesus, I know I am a sinner. I believe you died for my sins. Please forgive me for my sins and come into my heart. I

want to come to Heaven when I die."

The Bible shows us that the gift of salvation gives life that lasts forever. John 3:15 says "That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have $e _ e _ _ 1$ life."

h v ns."
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
God has promised that we will live with Him forever. We won't even grow old when we are with Him!



After you ask Jesus into your heart, you can still sin. This is very sad but it is true. The Bible says so. There is a book in the Bible called I John and it is written to Christians. 1John 1:8 says "If we say that we h ___ e no s ___ n, we deceive (lie to) ourselves, and the truth is not

in us. You may tell a lie, cheat on a test, disobey your parent or teacher or do other things that do not please God."

You are sad when you sin because your Heavenly Father is not pleased with you when you sin. But He made a way to be happy again. I John 1:9 teaches us to tell Him what we did, and that we are sorry for what we did. Find the words of that verse. "If we c__ nf __ s o _ r s _ _ he is faithful and just to f ____ us our sins, and to cleanse (clean, wash) us from all unrighteousness (sin)."



The Bible tells us that all who have prayed and asked Jesus for his gift of salvation should be baptized. Baptism follows salvation.

The word "baptize" means to go under water. That reminds me of a submarine. It goes down into the ocean. Did you ever dip a cookie into milk? Our family says that is "dunking" a cookie. When we are baptized we go down under the water.

We are laid back into the water as a picture of Jesus' death. The preacher lowers you under the water as a picture of Jesus' burial. When we come up out of the water we show that Jesus came back to life.

Being baptized shows the world that we are now one with Jesus Christ.

The jailer and all the others in his house accepted Jesus as their Savior that night.



How should I be baptized?

Going to the water is a picture of Jesus going to the cross and dying for our sin.

When we go down under the water, it shows how Jesus died and was put into the grave.

When we come up out of the water, it shows how Jesus came out of the grave. He was alive again and lives up in Heaven.



When you get baptized it shows others that you believe in Jesus; you have asked him to forgive your sins and have received the gift of salvation. We are showing that we want to be like Jesus."

Sometimes people get water sprinkled on their head but sprinkling would not need <u>much water</u>. The people of the Bible were never sprinkled when they believed in Jesus.

Matthew 28:19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

Acts 8:36-39 And as they went on *their* way, they came unto a certain water: and the eunuch said, See, *here is* water; what doth hinder me to be baptized? 37 And Philip said, If thou believest with all *thine* heart, *thou* mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. 38 And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him. 39 And when they were come up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught away Philip, that the eunuch saw him no more: and he went on his way rejoicing.

Acts 16:25-33 And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them.

- 26 And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed.

In each city the people who were saved through Jesus met together to pray and worship God. We are also to do the same. God told us in Hebrews 10:25 not to stay away from church.

Here are things the church family does together with a preacher (pastor).



The saved people have "communion" together. I Corinthians11:26 tells us to have communion until Jesus comes back. It says, "For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death t ____1 he ___



When someone gets saved, they are to be baptized with the church people together. It is a time to show others we now believe in Jesus and want to follow him. Acts 2:41 tells of almost three thousand people who were baptized and added to the church. Acts 2:41 says "Then they that gladly received his word were b__ p__ ized: and the same day there were a__ ded unto th __ _ about three thousand souls.





We must have teaching and preaching to help us in our Christian walk. We are to be taught and helped by God's special workers who speak to us when we meet together.

Here is what God says he gave us in Ephesians 4:11&12. "And he (God) gave some a__ _ stles; and some, p__ _ ets; and some, ev__ _ gelists; and some, p_ _t_rs and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints (saved ones), for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the b___y of C__ ist (That's us):

God called us the church about sixty times in the New Testament. He planned for us to meet together. As his children we must obey him and honour his will. It does not matter if we meet together in a room or in a building, we are still His church.



Lesson Six

The church has a time called *communion*. Jesus had communion with his 12 apostles on the evening he was taken prisoner, before he went to the cross. Communion is when we remember that Jesus died for us.

These verses are about the last supper Jesus had on earth. It was the last Passover supper ever needed by those who believe on him. Fill in the blanks and then read the verse out loud.



Luke 22:7 Then came the day of unleavened bread, when the Pass o__ er must be ki__ ed.

Before Jesus died there was a day each year called Passover. Those who obeyed God would kill a lamb that had no marks or sickness.

The people also had to eat the meat of the lamb and eat bread that did not have any yeast in it. Yeast was a symbol for sin.

The lamb's blood was shed, but it could not wash the sin away. The next year they had to kill another lamb!




The next verses tell about the last Passover supper.

Luke 22:8 says "And he (Jesus) sent Peter and John, saying, Go and prepare us the passover, that w __ may e__ _."



Luke 22:13-15. And they went, and found as he had said unto them: and they made ready the passover And when the hour was come, he sat down, and the twelve apostles with him. And he said unto them, With desire I have desired to eat this passover with you b__ _ _ re I suffer:

Luke 22:17-18 says "And he took <i>the</i> cup, and gave, and said, Te this, and dide <i>it</i> among yourselves:" Each one was to drink some of the grape juice. In the next set of verses he tells them to share the broken bread.
Luke 22:19-20 shows us what Jesus did. "And he took bread, and gave thanks, and b it, and gave unto them, saying, This is my body which is given for you: this do in re_brance of me. 20 Likewise also the cup after supper, saying, This cup is the n w tesent in my blood, which is shed for you."
He was telling them that he was the Lamb of God. He was going to be the sacrifice. When they shared communion, the grape juice was to remind them of his blood. The broken pieces of bread were to remind them of his body that was going to be broken for them. In the Book of I Corinthians Paul told the church to have times of Communion. He told them what Jesus did so they would do it the right way.
This is what he wrote to the church in I Corinthians 11:23-25
Verse 23 For I have received of the Lord <i>that</i> which also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the <i>same</i> n in which he was bt_a_ed took bread:
Verse 24 And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my b, which is brken for y: this d in rebrance ofe.
Verse 25 After the same manner also <i>he took</i> the cup, when <i>he</i> had supped, saying, This cup is the testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye <i>it</i> , in remembrance of me."






The Bible teaches us to give a tenth of all that we have to God. This is called the tithe (tie-th). More than that is an offering (off-er-ing).

God has given His Word, the Bible, to us so we may know Him. The Bible teaches us that boys and girls all are sinners. You cannot go into Heaven and take your sin with you. God has provided a gift for you that washes away sin.

Learn how you can have the gift of forgiven sins

This is what I am if I have not asked for God's gift to wash away my sins. You will find the Bible verses for this lesson on page 4. Fill in the blanks then read the verse out loud. Think about what it says!

Sheep must have a shepherd to guide them and keep them safe. They would soon die or be killed without a shepherd. The Bible calls Jesus "The Good Shepherd". The good shepherd gives his own life for the sheep.

The sixth word in Romans 5: 10 shows us that without Jesus we are God's en E m I es.

The Bible tells me and you in Ephesians 2:1 that without Jesus we are d E ad in trespasses and sin.

When sin came into the world we died spiritually. God separated Himself from us because he cannot live with sin.

The last ten words in this verse tell what you are if you have not

asked God to forgive you and wash your sins away through Jesus.

Ephesians 2:12 "... having no hope, and w I t H out G O D in the world.

Romans 3:23 says "For all have sinned, and come s $\underline{H} \underline{O} r \underline{T}$ of the G I O r Y of G O d;"

Sin is when we lie, cheat, steal, hurt others in anger, disobey and many other things. You cannot go into heaven the way you are. You are a sinner.

That all sounds very bad but God loved you so much that he made a way to heaven through his own son, Jesus. Jesus is his gift to you.

With His blood He can wash away your sins so you can go to

Romans 10:9 and 10 tells you to confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus, and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead. God will save you from sin. Believe in Jesus with all your heart and tell God with your own mouth that you want him to forgive your sins. Tell Him you want Jesus to be your Saviour.

After you ask Jesus into your heart, you can still sin. This is very sad but it is true. The Bible says so. There is a book in the Bible called I John and it is written to Christians. 1John 1:8 says "If we say that we h $\underline{\mathbf{A}} \ \underline{\mathbf{V}}$ e no s $\underline{\mathbf{I}}$ n, we deceive (lie to) ourselves, and the truth is not

in us. You may tell a lie, cheat on a test, disobey your parent or teacher or do other things that do not please God."

You are sad when you sin because your Heavenly Father is not pleased with you when you sin. But He made a way to be happy again. I John 1:9 teaches us to tell Him what we did, and that we are sorry for what we did. Find the words of that verse. "If we c <u>O</u> nf <u>E</u> <u>S</u> s o <u>U</u> r s <u>I</u> N he is faithful and just to f <u>O</u> R <u>G</u> I <u>V</u> e us *our* sins, and to cleanse (clean, wash) us from all unrighteousness (sin)."

Lesson three Answer Key



The Bible tells us that all who have prayed and asked Jesus for his gift of salvation should be baptized. Baptism follows salvation.

The word "baptize" means to go under water. That reminds me of a submarine. It goes down into the ocean. Did you ever dip a cookie into milk? Our family says that is "dunking" a cookie. When we are baptized we go down under the water.

We are laid back into the water as a picture of Jesus' death. The preacher lowers you under the water as a picture of Jesus' burial. When we come up out of the water we show that Jesus came back to life.

Being baptized shows the world that we are now one with Jesus Christ.

Why should I be baptized?

In Matthew 28:19 God says "Go therefore and teach all nations, b <u>A P</u> t <u>I z I N G</u> t <u>H</u> e <u>M</u> in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:" In John 14:15 God tells those who are saved "If ye love me, k <u>E E P</u> my c <u>O</u> m <u>M A N D</u> ments" *God tells us to be baptized! That is his commandment.*

When should I be baptized?

In Acts 8:36 a man who just accepted Jesus gift of salvation asked theevangelist (preacher) this: "See, *here is* water; what doth hinder me to be baptized?" The answer in verse 37 was "And Phillip said, If thou be $\underline{\mathbf{L}} \ \underline{\mathbf{I}} \ \underline{\mathbf{E}} \ \mathbf{v} \ \underline{\mathbf{E}} \ \mathrm{st}$ (believe) with a $\underline{\mathbf{l}} \ \underline{\mathbf{l}} \ \underline{\mathbf{l}} \ thine$ h $\underline{\mathbf{E}} \ \underline{\mathbf{A}} \ \underline{\mathbf{R}} \ \mathbf{t}$, thou mayest."

Read Acts 16: 25-33. In verse 30 the jailer asked "Sirs what must I do to be saved?" He was told to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ (believe that Jesus is the Savior, he shed His blood for our sins, and rose again).

The jailer and all the others in his house accepted Jesus as their Savior that night.



How should I be baptized?

Going to the water is a picture of Jesus going to the cross and dying for our sin.

When we go down under the water, it shows how Jesus died and was put into the grave.

When we come up out of the water, it shows how Jesus came out of the grave. He was alive again and lives up in Heaven.

God caused holy men to hear his words and told them to write them down. He gave us the Bible to warn us about sin, to show us when we are doing wrong, and to teach us how to live His way.

Why should you read and learn the Bible?

God commanded us to read and learn his Word. II Timothy 2:15 says, "STUDY to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed rightly dividing the Word of truth.



Psalm 119:105 explains. "Thy word is a $1 \underline{\mathbf{A}} \underline{\mathbf{M}} \underline{\mathbf{P}}$ unto my $\underline{\mathbf{F}} \underline{\mathbf{E}} \underline{\mathbf{E}} \underline{\mathbf{T}}$, and a $1 \underline{\mathbf{I}} \underline{\mathbf{g}} \underline{\mathbf{H}} \underline{\mathbf{T}}$ unto my path.

In Psalm 73:24 King David wrote, "Thou shalt g **U I** d **E** me with thy counsel, and afterward receive me to glory."

The word **counsel** means instruction or guidance. The Bible will show you the way to go so you do not get into trouble. The Bible will guard you from sin.

Psalm 119:11 says, "Thy <u>W O R D</u> have I hid in mine heart, that I might not <u>S I N</u> against Thee.



The Bible is your guide book. It keeps you safe on the path of life. The Bible will help you to please God and to have rewards when you go to Heaven.





The church has a time called *communion*. Jesus had communion with his 12 apostles on the evening he was taken prisoner, before he went to the cross. Communion is when we remember that Jesus died for us.

The lamb's blood was shed, but it could not wash the sin away. The next year they had to kill another lamb!



The next verses tell about the last Passover supper.

Luke 22:8 says "And he (Jesus) sent Peter and John, saying, Go and prepare us the passover, that w **E** may e **A T**."

He was telling them that he was the Lamb of God. He was going to be the sacrifice, and when they shared communion, the grape juice was to remind them of his blood and the broken pieces of bread were to remind them of his body that was going to be broken for them.

In the Book of I Corinthians Paul told the church to have times of Communion. He told them what Jesus did so they would do it the right way.

Psalm 27:11 "Teach me thy way, O LORD, and <u>L E A D</u> me in a plain path, b <u>E C</u> ause of mine enemies." The devil is your enemy. He uses other people and your own mind to lead you wrong.

Prayer is also praising him for his greatness and thanking him for his goodness.

When should we pray?

How should we pray?



Pray humbly as **Luke 18:13** shows. "And the publican, standing afar off, would not $l \underline{I} \underline{F} t$ up so much as \underline{HIS} e $\underline{Y} \underline{E} s$ unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be m $\underline{E} r \underline{C} \underline{I} ful$ to me a sinner."

Who should we pray to?

Matthew 6:9 tells you this; "After this manner therefore pray ye: our F A T H e R..."

John 14:14 shows us to pray in Jesus' name "If ye will ask anything in $\underline{\mathbf{Y}}$ n $\underline{\mathbf{A}} \underline{\mathbf{M}} \underline{\mathbf{E}}$, I will do it."

I John 5:14 has one more lesson on praying. "And this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything acc OR dIng to HIS WILL He heareth us:" You must ask in His will. Jesus prayed before he went to the cross and said "...not my will, but thine, be done."

Romans 8:26 says "Likewise the $\underline{S} \underline{P} \underline{I} \underline{R}$ it also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us . . .". The Holy Spirit is inside of you from the moment you are saved and he helps you when you pray.

Hebrews 4:16 says "Let us therefore come b $\underline{\mathbf{O}}$ $\underline{\mathbf{L}}$ dly unto the throne of grace . . ." (Never be afraid of your Heavenly Father.)

Sin will hurt your prayers. If you have sinned, ask God to forgive you. I John 1:9 says that if we confess our sins he is faithful and just to forgive our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Rejoice!

It brings joy to God and his angels when someone is saved!

Psalm 107:2 "Let the redeemed of the LORD say *so*, whom He hath redeemed from the hand of the enemy;"

When we speak out and someone gets saved they are saved from the hand of the devil! God wants us to speak out.



The Bible teaches us when, where and how we are to share the gospel with others. The Gospel is the good news of salvation

Everyone needs to hear the gospel witness. Be sure to share God's word. That is what the precious seed is.

Do not be afraid. Do not quit if others get angry or say you are not allowed to talk about Jesus. Jesus spoke God's Word when others were mean to him. Pray for help to tell others.



Lesson Nine Answer Key

The Bible teaches us to give a tenth of all that we have to God. This is called *the tithe* (tie-th) . More than that is an *offering* (*off-er-ing*).

There are many needs in God's work. The tithes and offerings are how those needs are met.

Offerings can also be other othings. God's people brought the things that were needed to build the Tabernacle (tab-er-nack-el). You can read about that in Exodus 25:1-7.

Read the story of God's promise to care for Jacob and Jacob's promise to give back to God in Genesis 28:10-22.



Malachi 3:8 "Will a man R o B G O d? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings."

God told his people they were robbing him. Are you being a thief?

Malachi 3:10 "Bring ye all the \underline{T} \underline{I} \underline{T} \underline{H} \underline{E} \underline{S} into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the LORD of hosts, if I will not \underline{P} \underline{E} \underline{n} you the windows of \underline{h} \underline{E} \underline{A} \underline{v} \underline{E} \underline{n} , and pour you out a blessing, that *there shall* not *be room* enough *to receive it.*"

Do not think that you will give God two dollars so he will give you four dollars. That is evil. God gave us the earth and all that is good. We give back to him in love. We obey his Word. He is so very kind that he blesses us more!

Giving to God is like growing a spiritual garden.

II Corinthians 9:6 "But this *I say*, He which soweth $\underline{\mathbf{P}} \underline{\mathbf{A}}$ r $\underline{\mathbf{I}}$ ngly shall reap also $\underline{\mathbf{S}} \underline{\mathbf{P}} \underline{\mathbf{A}} \underline{\mathbf{R}} \underline{\mathbf{I}} \underline{\mathbf{N}} \underline{\mathbf{G}} \underline{\mathbf{L}} \underline{\mathbf{Y}}$; and he which soweth $\underline{\mathbf{O}} \underline{\mathbf{U}} \underline{\mathbf{N}}$ tifully shall $\underline{\mathbf{R}} \underline{\mathbf{E}} \underline{\mathbf{A}} \underline{\mathbf{P}}$ also bountifully."

The word soweth means plant. Reapeth means to gather what grew from your plants. If you plant a lot of seeds you will grow a lot of plants that will give a lot of fruit or vegetables (veg-a-ta-bels).

II Corinthians 9:7 "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him GIVE not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a c HE ER ful giver."

God is all good and deserves our worship. Tithing and offering is part of our worship.

I Corinthians 9:13-14 "Do ye not know that they which minister about holy things live *of the things* of the temple? and they which wait at the altar are partakers with the altar? Even so hath the **LORD** ordained that they which **pREA** ch the gospel should **LIVE** of the gospel."

Pastors, evangelists and missionaries must be able to study God's Word, preach, teach, pray, and visit many people to care for them. They must serve God with their whole life. Our tithes and offerings care for them!



God's child is not part of the World. The Bible teaches us not to be like the world anymore. We should not look and act like the world.

God also shows us that we must only go to a Bible teaching church.
