This is the story behind the hymn, Blest Be the Tie That Binds.

John Fawcett was born into a poor family in Yorkshire, England, and was orphaned at age 12. To survive, he accepted a lengthy apprenticeship to a tailor. Then, while still in his teens, he heard the great George Whitfield preach and became a Christian.

While serving his apprenticeship, Fawcett became active in a Baptist church and was often asked to speak. Then at age 25 (and newly married) he was invited to serve as pastor of a small church at Wainsgate. The poor people of that little village were able to pay very little, and much of Fawcett's pay came as potatoes and other produce. Once his wife, Mary, began having children, they found it difficult to survive.

Then Fawcett learned that the pastor of a large Baptist church in London was retiring, and he let the church know that he would be interested in serving them. They called him to be their pastor at a much larger salary, so John and Mary packed their household and prepared to move. But then, as the story is told, Mary told John that she didn't think that she could leave these people whom they had both learned to love – and John allowed that he shared her sentiment – so the two of them unpacked the wagon and let the London church know that they wouldn't be coming.

Then Fawcett, who wrote a number of hymns during his lifetime, wrote this hymn, "Blest Be the Tie," to convey his sentiments and those of his wife to the poor people among whom they had chosen to live. Fawcett served that little church for the rest of his life – 54 years in all.

I was thinking about the ability to raise a good supply of produce in Alaska and wondered if they grow potatoes, so I went online and found an article that answered my questions. I thought you all would also enjoy it. { *Foods that Grow in Alaska : Agriculture might not be the first thing that comes to mind when you think of*



Alaska. Home to frozen landscapes, snow-covered mountains, glaciers and months of darkness, it's not exactly the kind of place you would expect to find a lot of productive farmlands. Despite the state's harsh climate in the winter months, however, there are 762 farms and over 800,000 acres of farmland in the state. And while farming in Alaska is often a challenge, the short but intense growing season in the summer can actually yield world-record-size produce. Potatoes are one of the

most valuable crops grown in Alaska, contributing a net value of over \$3 million to the state's economy annually, Planting usually begins in the middle of May, when the day length reaches about 17 hours, and the growing season continues through September. The continuous sunlight during the summer creates favorable conditions for crop production, particularly in the Matanuska Valley where the sun barely falls below the horizon from mid-May to mid-August. Common potato varieties grown in the state include Yukon Gold, Russet Norkotah and Green Mountain.} Sounds great, and if we were younger, I think we would do well to go to Alaska for those sunny months, grow produce, sell it, and then come back to the other states for the dark months there. Since that's not gonna happen for us, maybe someone else can take the idea and run with it!Carl's arm is more agile but still very touchy when he moves it. It swells sometimes and then we get the ice on it and get him ibuprofen. That usually works after a while. For me, Mrs. E., I am soooo thankful to have another female to talk to here. God has blessed us! Carl's arm is improving some each week now, but he got a burn on his hand due to a severe poison ivy reaction. His hand and fingers swelled terribly, and he got big blisters on the fingers. It was on his left hand, the one that was on the broken arm. He had, for the first time, decided to try to work. He supported the bad arm and used the hand to steady and hold 2 large electric cords he was cleaning and putting new ends on. They had gotten hit by the mower when the grass got tall enough that it hid where the cords were. Anyway, He worked for some time that way, pulling them through his left hand, wiping with his right hand. There must have been cut off ivy that juiced up those cords. Carl could not scrub and rinse the left hand well and he did not get it done enough. I would have helped, but I did not realize that ivy was growing out there. He didn't either! His hand and fingers swelled and got huge blisters on the fingers. The doctor told us that the ivy actually burned his hand and that he must have Silvadene, a burn ointment, put on twice a day and bandaged with wide gauze and tape. That's not all of it though, his hand touched his stomach and chest at night and the ivy was on them before it got bad enough on the hand to realize what it was. He has suffered pure misery day after day and night after night. We know that God does allow suffering in our lives, and it is always for good somehow. We continue to look up to our perfect, inerrant God..... So far, after only one day, we have met the need of several in those groups, but also helped a young lady who was saved 4 years ago and came directly to Bible College. She was sharing that she had never been trained in these important areas. She took a thumb drive to better learn for herself. As we talked though, she also decided to use the lessons to disciple her mother, a recently saved drug addict. She also plans to teach her 15-year-old brother who is autistic. Another young lady is getting ready to return to her home in Alaska where she will deliver the lessons to her pastor dad. She also was taking back the junior lessons so she can disciple 7 little Alaskans who were saved under her dad's ministry.... During the morning hours, I had asked God if there weren't some folks who could use the kids' lessons that had been a long time in preparation, developed painstakingly! I can only give God the glory!.... there are over 30 missions' agencies here, but we are the only ones who have a ministry of helps for teaching the Word, so we do a lot of conversing with all the other reps as well as the leaders at the college and the students here. It's such a unique opportunity! I wish we could let you hear the sounds in this room where all the displays are. The buzz of all the different students and workers discussing missions is amazing. Everyone is focused on serving the Lord Jesus Christ at a present ministry or helping someone to serve him in a new way. Can you imagine the honor this is to our precious Saviour and to God the Father and God, the Spirit?!....I do not know how much longer Carl and I can travel places with the ministry, but we aim to go as long as we are able. We also pray for replacements for this part of the outreach. We would be satisfied to stay home and minister to you folks. So pray for those things, will you?.... I leave you who are born again with a reminder of one huge responsibility. It is the ministry of reconciling others to God. We are His witnesses. We are a light to a dark world. You do not have to be someplace different to do the job; you just need to be faithful where you are. That seems impossible to some but allow me to encourage you to ask God to guide you, protect you, and direct you. Use his Word because the Word is powerful. I will add some scriptures for you now. Two would be with missionary parents on the field while the other would be with older missionaries. I also took along 9 or 10 china dolls that were

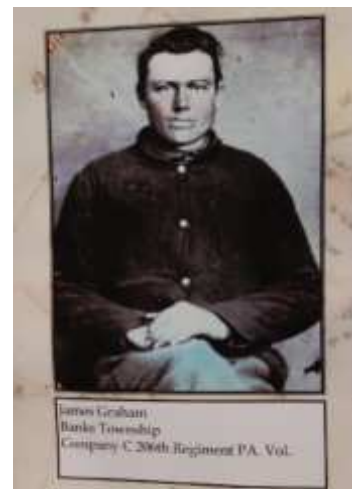
